Since then, the estimate for any kind of work has only increased. Through grants available for such work at the time of the proposals, the town would have seen a minimal cost if any at all, Mr. Barrett said.

When approaching the select board about the issue, the Barretts say they've had a hard time getting Newport Center's leadership to address the pond. The select board decided that they'd take the issue before the town, but the proposals never moved forward from there.

After delays due to the pandemic, the issue never was heard as planned at the Town Meeting. The Barretts say that they've tried to get the select board members to act directly on the issue, but were met with resistance.

"Steve Barrup refers to it as 'the swamp," Ms. Barrett said. "He doesn't have to live near it. It used to be a pond." Multiple attempts to reach members of the Newport Center Select Board for comment on the pond were unsuccessful.

Twilight Stars Party at Old Stone House Museum

"This is a one-of-a-kind event," Kristal Wood, the museum's associate director of public events, said. "The whole family can find something to enjoy, plus sitting on Prospect Hill as the sun sets and music plays is something you won't want to miss."

Early bird tickets are \$5 for all ages above 5 years old. On the day of the event, tickets cost \$10 for all ages and are free for children under 5 years old. Old Stone House Museum and Historic Village members are half price (\$5) no matter when they buy.

People are encouraged to bring their own picnic blanket or lawn chair to sit on for the event.
