Two adult chaperones required per group of 10 remain with each group at all times. Chaperones are sometimes asked to participate in activities and should be willing to do so.

Fee for Spring Field Day is \$140.00 per group of up to ten students.

If your group has fewer than 10 students the group rate applies. A group is capped at 12 students unless permission is granted by coordinator

Each additional student over 10 in a group pays an additional \$12 per student. Teachers & 2 chaperones per group required, at no cost.

Cancellations within 48 hours of the event & no show groups will be charged. **Rain or Shine.**

Workshop Descriptions, Spring Field Days 2023

Brownie the Cow 5/17 only - Before walking or riding horseback to school each day, children had to get up early and do their chores. Students in this workshop will get to milk Brownie the cow and shake up some butter, a common spring chore.

Oxen 5/25 only- Come and join the Michaud family and meet the team of Devonshire Oxen. Learn about these hard working animals that helped rural Vermonters plow their land and assisted Alexander Twilight in building the Old Stone House.

Sheepmania 5/25 only- Learn about the time period when there were more sheep than people in Vermont and see Kate's sheep get their annual wool cut. See shearing and play an exciting relay game related to wool processing.

Blacksmith 5/17 or 5/25- Participants will see a demonstration with a master Blacksmith at the Henderson Forge. Courtney, our blacksmith creates objects primarily from wrought iron by forging the metal using tools to hammer, bend and cut to create farm tools and decorative pieces.

Beekeeping 5/17 only - Spend this workshop with Apiarist and museum volunteer Garrett Thibault. Participants will have an opportunity to safely view an observation box with a frame of nurse bees, brood and queen. Learn about the different caste of bees, their life cycle and role in the hive, see equipment used by apiarists. Discussions related to bee biology, how beekeepers manage hives, and what products and services honey bees provide. Participants with bee allergies should bring their epi pens and be aware that we will be safely in the vicinity of our sweet pollinators.

Museum Tour 5/25 only - Learn the history of Brownington and Orleans County, including the story of Alexander Lucius Twilight. Learn local heritage, 19th century history, art or other topics related to the history of Orleans County and the Northeast Kingdom.

Circle Dancing 5/17 or 5/25 - Join Neskaya Movement Arts Dance Teacher, Daisy McCoy for social dances done in a circle to folk music from around the world. Dances often celebrate the season and natural cycles and all are beginner friendly. There are no mistakes, only variations. No partners or experience necessary.

Pond Studies - 5/17 or 5/25. Dip right into the pond with nets behind the Lawrence Barn in this active class as we jump into investigations using bug boxes and hand lenses and take a close up look at the fascinating world of Macro (non microscopic) Invertebrates (animals without a backbone) that live in the pond. Learn how to identify water quality based on animal diversity of pond creatures and learn about the entire pond ecosystem.

Made by Hand - Woodworking 5/17 only- Join master woodworker, Dan Chasse, as he demonstrates the simplicity of staked furniture and demonstrates the construction of a stick stool. The stool is the first step to learning how to build stick chairs. Legs will be shaped by hand (not on a lathe) and joined to the top by wedged mortise and tenons. Stools in various stages will be on hand to demonstrate the steps taken in building from scratch a stool. Some student assistance will be needed. I'm sure we will have some volunteers.

Textiles and Fibers 5/17 only- Learn about the cottage industries of the early 19th century and try your hand at weaving and carding wool. See Textiles of all kinds from plant to animal fibers and learn about the changing technologies of these industries.
